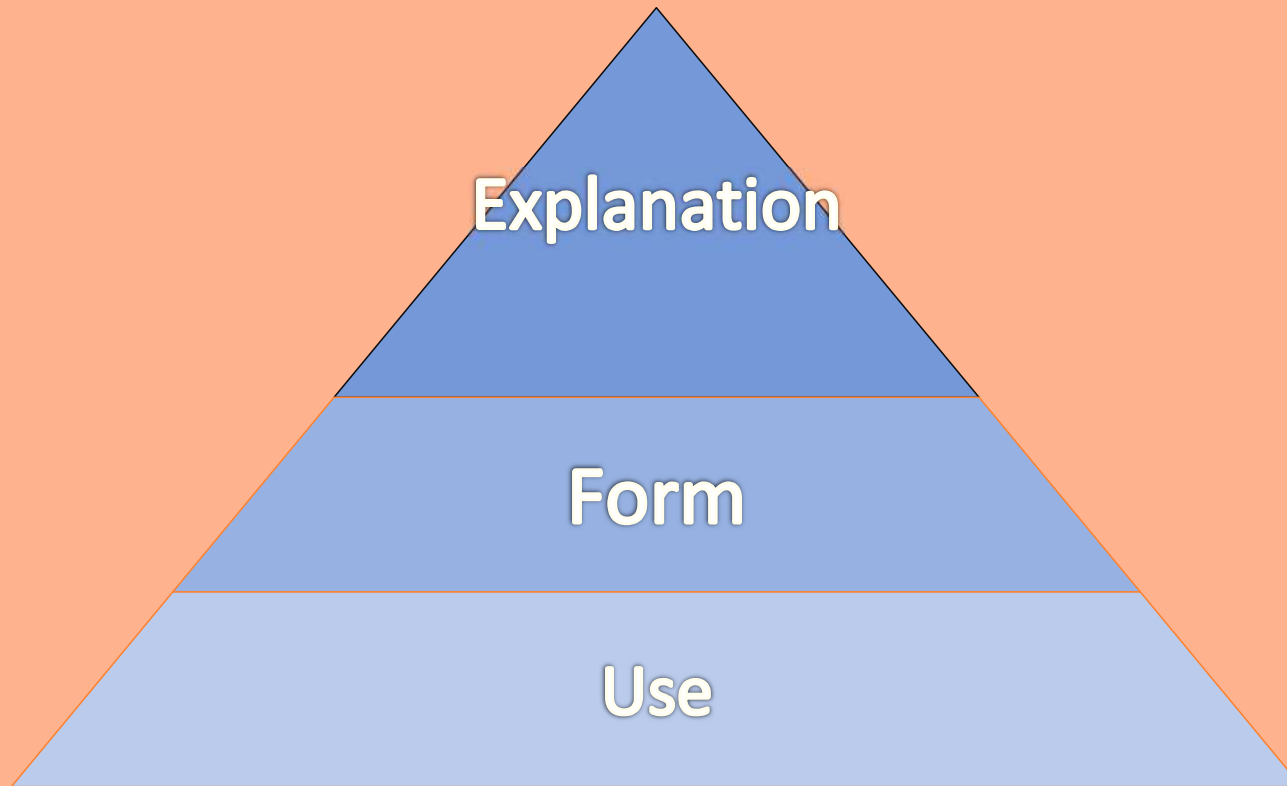


ADVERBS AND ADJECTIVES OF MANNER



EXPLANATION

Adverbs of Manner add more information to verbs to make them more specific. **Adverbs of Manner** always come after a verb and can be used with words like very or too. **Adverbs of Manner** are **adjectives** that almost always end with -ly, though some are also irregular.

ADJECTIVES AND ADVERBS OF MANNER

Adjectives tell us something about a person or a thing.
Adjectives can modify nouns or pronouns.

Adverbs tell us in what way someone does something.
Adverbs can modify verbs, adjectives or other adverbs

**John is a very careful person.
He is very careful.**

**John drives carefully.
He drives carefully.**

To modify verbs	The soccer team played badly last weekend.
To modify adjectives	It was a very bad game.
To modify adverbs	The soccer team played very badly last weekend.
To modify quantities	There were quite a lot of people in the stadium.
To modify sentences	Unfortunately , our team didn't have any chance to win.
