

SUBJECT PRONOUNS AND POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun.

Subject pronouns are the nouns that are the actors of the main action.

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES ARE USED TO EXPRESS POSSESSION AND OWNING.

AFTER POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE, COMES A NOUN.

For example: This is not **my** handbag.
