TOO MUCH

We can use too much before uncountable nouns to mean more than necessary.

**too much
+
uncountable
noun**



**I have too much work
to do.**

**There is too much
pollution in the city.**

TOO MUCH

We can use too much after a verb.

**Verb
+
too much**

**I have eaten too
much.**

**I worked too much
today.**



TOO MANY

We can use too many before countable plural nouns to mean more than necessary.

**too many
+
countable
noun**

**There are too many
people here.**

**He created too many
problems.**



ENOUGH

We can use enough before nouns to mean the correct amount of quantity.

**enough
+
noun**

**I have enough money
to buy this phone.**

**He didn't have enough
time to talk.**



ENOUGH

We can use enough after adjectives or adverbs.

**Adj. – Adv.
+
enough**

**I am 15, I am not old
enough to drive.**

**Let's swim, it is warm
enough.**



ENOUGH

We can use enough after verbs.

the test.**
