We use too to express that something more than necessary.

too

adv. + adj.

TOO

Too has a negative meaning as it means more than necessary.

too early too hot too fast It is too hot today.

You drive too fast.

It is too early to leave.



TOO MUCH

We can use too much before uncountable nouns to mean more than necessary.

too much + uncountable noun I have too much work to do.

There is too much pollution in the city.



TOO MUCH

We can use too much after a verb.

Verb + too much I have eaten too much.

I worked too much today.



TOO MANY

We can use too many before countable plural nouns to mean more than necessary.

too many + countable

noun

There are too many people here.

He created too many problems.



ENOUGH

We can use enough before nouns to mean the correct amount of quantity.

enough + noun I have enough money to buy this phone.

He didn't have enough time to talk.



ENOUGH

We can use enough after adjectives or adverbs.

Adj. – Adv. + enough I am 15, I am not old enough to drive.

Let's swim, it is warm enough.



ENOUGH

We can use enough after verbs.

Verb + enough I studied enough for the test.

You talked enough.



TO INFINITIVE

We can use enough and too with to infinitive.

to V

I studied enough to pass the test.

I spent too much time to finish the task.
