

# QUANTIFIERS

We use quantifiers to describe quantity of something  
We can use quantifiers with countable and uncountable nouns.

## Countables

a lot of / lots of  
many  
some  
few

## Uncountables

lot of / lots of  
much  
Some  
little

# A LOT OF

**We can use a lot of / lots of with both countable and uncountable nouns.  
We use a lot of / lots of mostly in positive sentences**

## **Countables**

**There are a lot of people in this room.**

**He has lots of books.**

**There are a lot of cats in this park.**

## **Uncountables**

**I have a lot of time.**

**She has a lot of money.**

**There is a lot of traffic today.**

# MANY / MUCH

**We use many with countable nouns.  
We use much with uncountable nouns.  
We use many / much usually in affirmative sentences.**

## **Many with Countables**

**There aren't many students here.**

**I don't have many friends .**

**There aren't many children in this park.**

## **Much with Uncountables**

**I don't have much time.**

**She doesn't have much money.**

**There isn't much traffic today.**

# HOW MANY / HOW MUCH

**We use how many/how much to ask about quantity.**

**How many with countable nouns.**

**How much with uncountable nouns.**

## **How many with Countables**

**How many** students are there in the classroom?

**How many** people will come today?

**How many** hours do you work in a day?.

## **How much with Uncountables**

**How much** time do we have?

She doesn't have much money.

There isn't **much** traffic today.

# SOME

**We can use some both with countable and uncountable nouns.**

**We use some in affirmative sentences.**

**We can use some for offers and requests.**

## **Some (+)**

**I have some time. Lets  
drink something.**

**She has some friends  
with her.**

**I will drink some milk.**

## **Some (Request-Offers)**

**Would you like some  
tea?**

**May I have some rice?**

**Would you like some  
fries?**

# A FEW / A LITTLE

**We use few with countable nouns.  
We use little with uncountable nouns.  
We use few and little in affirmative sentences.**

## **Few**

**There are a few chairs in the room.**

**She has a few friends waiting outside.**

**I have a few hours.**

## **Little**

**I have a little time.**

**She spent a little money.**

**There is a little milk in the fridge.**

# A FEW / A LITTLE

**few – little >> means not enough**

**a few – a little >> enough**

## **a few / few**

**There are a few chairs.  
> (enough)**

**There are few chairs.  
> (not enough)**

## **a little / little**

**I have a little time.  
> enough**

**I have little time.  
> not enough**

# ANY

**We use any with both countable and uncountable nouns.**  
**We use any in questions and negative sentences.**

## **Any (?)**

**Do you have any time?**

**Are there any people there?**

**Is there any water left?**

## **Any (+)**

**I don't have any money.**

**There isn't any bread for breakfast.**

**There aren't any students in the class.**
