



Subject Questions with Prepositions

Subject Questions

- ▶ There are two types of questions. You need to know the difference between subject and object questions. Subject of the sentence is the person or the thing that performs an action. Object of the sentence is the person or the thing that receives the action.

- ▶ **EXAMPLES:**

Who did you invite? (Object Question) –I invited Selin and Esra.

Who invited you? (Subject Question) –Tolga invited me.

Object Questions with Prepositions



In object questions with «who, what, where, which, how», the preposition usually comes at the end of the sentence.

These prepositions include TO, FOR, FROM, WITH, AT ABOUT ON etc.

Example Sentences

- ❖ What are you looking *at*?
- ❖ Who is he waiting *for*?
- ❖ Where do you come *from*?
- ❖ Which university does your sister go *to*?
- ❖ Where is your friend *from*?
- ❖ Who did you give the letter *to*?
- ❖ What are they talking *about*?

What and Who as a Subject or Object Question

NOTE: Some questions include only a question word and a preposition. This is mostly used in informal style.

For example:

What with?

Who for?

What about?
