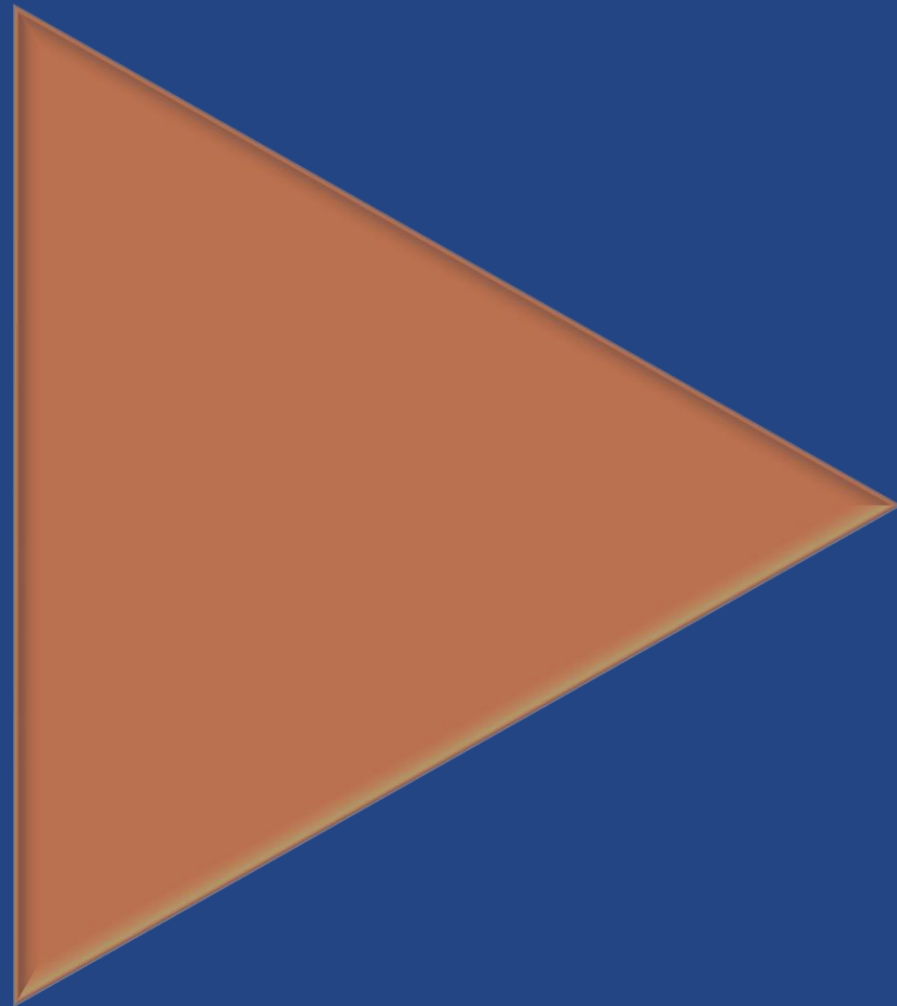


PRESENT CONTINUOUS FOR FUTURE ARRANGEMENTS



Structure

Uses

Let's remember the structure of Present Continuous first

Affirmative

S + to be + verb-ing

I am leaving tonight.

He/She/It is leaving tonight.

We/You/They **are leaving** tonight.

Negative

S+ to be + not + verb-ing

I **am not leaving** tonight.

She/He/It is **not leaving**.

We/You/They are not leaving tonight.

Interrogative

To be + S + verb-ing?

Am I leaving tonight?

Is he/she/it leaving tonight?

Are you/we/they leaving tonight?

WE CAN USE PRESENT CONTINUOUS TO
TALK ABOUT THE PLANS WE'VE ALREADY
ARRANGED.

EXAMPLE:

I'M GOING TO THE THEATRE TO SEE ROMEO AND JULIET
TOMORROW.

Examples:

- ❑ You're having an exam next monday. (Affirmative)
- ❑ Is your brother working tomorrow morning? (Interrogative)
- ❑ I am not attending the party. (Negative)
- ❑ Selin is coming tomorrow. (Affirmative)
- ❑ What are you doing on Saturday? (Interrogative)
- ❑ Are they meeting with us tonight? (Interrogative)
- ❑ Because of my injury, I am not playing in the game this week.
(Negative)
