during + noun

for + time period

while S + V

WHEN

How long?

At the same time

DURING

We use during + noun to talk about when an action happens.

during + noun She slept during the movie.

I will complete my homework during the summer break.



FOR

We use for + time period to talk about the duration of an action.

for + length of time

I have been living in Istanbul for ten years.

I have been running for 2 hours.



WHILE

We use while to talk about two actions happening at the same time.

while + S+V

I saw a rabbit while I was driving home.

She was sleeping while I was studying.
