USED TO - BE USED TO - GET USED TO

We use phrase 'used to' in different meanings, sometimes with different verbs.

Used to

Be used to

Get used to

When we talk about past routines or actions we did for a long time.

I **used to** run 20 kilometers a day when I was 25. But now, I don't.

I **used to** be lazy and lie around all day. Then one day, I stopped doing so.





Used to

Question and negative forms of **used to** are the same as Past Simple.

Did you **use to** ask a lot of questions when you were a kid?

I didn't use to do that. But I used to do a lot of research.



Note how the forms are similar to past simple.

E.g. She asked me a question. Did she ask me a question?

I used to ask a lot of questions.

Did you use to ask
a lot of questions?

We use 'be used to' to talk about our familiarities or habits. We can use it in any tense.

David and I **are used to** each other's jokes. We don't take them personal.

Are you used to writing?

My brother **was used to** dogs. But now, he finds them strange.

I have **been used to** dealing with difficulties. So, no problem.

Be used to

We use 'get used to' in order to mean that we adjust to something.

Wow, I've got used to working like this pretty quickly.

I'm getting used to the new decade 2020s.

How did you get used to the 2000s?

I had got used to petting my dog before I lost him.

I guess we have to get used to it after a while.
